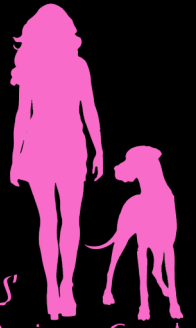


Litter Training Your Cat

Step One

Ensure the litter tray is bigger than your cat and deep enough for a good covering of litter

Step Two

Place the tray in an area that is quiet and away from food/water and white goods.
Add All the things your pet loves to the den.

Step Three

Encourage your cat or kitten to go into the tray, before and after food, after sleep, after play and anytime they seem to start scratching the ground, pacing and sniffing.

Step Four

Anytime your cat does go in the tray reward them with something tasty- ensure they are away from the tray first before trying to give them a treat as otherwise they may not take it.



Hints and Tips

Try not to leave your cat initially, this will prevent accidents whilst you are not there.

Clean the litter tray on a daily basis.

Accidents may happen- Do not to punish your cat but instead take them to the litter tray and clean up the area using enzyme cleaner

If you stick to a feeding routine it will make your cats toileting schedule more regular.
